

ORDINANCE NO. 2003 - 4

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 24, "FEES", OF THE VICTORIA CITY CODE TO CHANGE MISCELLANEOUS FEES THEREIN; REPEALING PARTS CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The City Council finds that the fees and rates prescribed in this ordinance are in amounts that are reasonably necessary to cover the costs of granting the licenses and permits described herein and exercising proper police regulation over said programs.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VICTORIA, TEXAS:

1.

Chapter 24 "Fees," of the Victoria City Code is amended to amend the following sections to read as follows:

(5) Fee for use of decorative lights in dome is \$35.00 per day.

(c) With the approval of the City Manager, the director of parks and recreation may (1) determine rates for events scheduled more than two years after the date the reservation is made and (2) offer reduced rates for selected seminars, conventions and meetings in accordance with the Victoria Community Center Regulations and Rental Rates. ~~Rental rates for use of the community center facilities after the last date provided by the schedules shown above shall be as provided in subsection (a) with adjustments reflecting changes in the cost of operations, as reflected by fluctuations in the consumer price index for urban wage earners for the southwest statistical summary, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The Director of Parks and Recreation, with approval of the City Manager, may calculate such adjustments and publish new rate schedules.~~

2.

All parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

3.

If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such validity shall not affect the other provisions, or application thereof, of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

4.

The Code of the City of Victoria, Texas, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect, save and except as amended by this ordinance.

5.

It is the intention of the City Council that this Ordinance shall become a part of the Code of the City of Victoria, Texas and it may be renumbered and codified therein accordingly.

6.

Except as otherwise provided herein, the provisions of this ordinance shall become effective ten days after adoption by the City Council.



