APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 2, 2005 were approved as presented.

CITIZENS COMMUNICATION**Median Cut and Traffic Light on North Navarro**

David Karl, Representative of Mac Haik Enterprises, stated that his interest was with a 37 acre tract of land for development on N. Navarro. He advised that the development would be affected by the proposed median and median cuts that The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDot) was planning along that section of Highway. He stated that a lease with Academy, the major tenant, had already been signed. He advised that originally there was no plan for a median cut at the Wal-Mart opening between Glasgow and Broadmoor, but TxDot felt that one would be advantageous for safety purposes as the property develops. He asked the City to install a traffic light on N. Navarro at that median cut.

Mayor Armstrong advised that after a meeting with TxDot and City Staff it was determined that a median would be placed in that location, with the contingency that a light would go in at that location.

McNamara House and Nave Museum Requests

Denise Roussel, 13 Meadowview, representing McNamara House and the Nave Museum requested 1% of the hotel-motel tax funds for arts tourism, and 3% which would be a one-time request to promote heritage tourism and assistance with the restoration of McNamara House Museum. She stated that these two facilities help to promote heads in beds by attracting visitors to the community and have been instrumental in the display of various types of art.

South Texas Zoo Requests

Tom Willis, 108 Greenway, representing the South Texas Zoo, gave a brief update on the activities at the Zoo. He stated that a consultant came in and advised them that the first thing they needed was a gift shop, he also told them that they needed some new exhibits. They have been able to expand the red wolf exhibit and build a people friendly exhibit for the newly acquired jaguar. He reported there were approximately 2,500 visitors this last month. He advised that the zoo does a lot of educational activities and most grants deal with some form of education. Mr. Willis stated that the consultant also advised them that they should request volunteer annexation of the donated property which will house the new zoo, so as to help attract a water park participant. He requested \$135,000 from the City at this time.

Texas Settlement Region Requests

Barbara Kennedy, representing the Texas Settlement Region, requested continued support of their non-profit organization in the amount of \$8,000. She advised that the LaSalle Odyssey of museum collections has been completed, and they are now able to focus on the counties that have gathered together to promote cultural and heritage tourism in the region. She advised that this is a total volunteer working board and no longer have a paid working staff, since their board has the mobility and ability to do the work without pay.

Cm. Guittard, commented that if it had not been for those involved with this group there would not be a LaSalle Odyssey, Museum of the Coastal Bend, or a planned replica of Ft. St. Louis. He encouraged some funding of the organization and stated that heritage tourism is different than regular tourism.

Concerns about Brush Pick up and Drop off Rate Increases

Frank Snyder, 305 S. Glass, expressed concerns with Texas Landfill Management taking over the brush site and charging a fee for collection at curb side and drop off fees. He presented documentation showing that others don't charge anything for this type of service. He was asked to leave that documentation with staff so that it could be reviewed. Mr. Snyder was informed that taxpayers are absorbing the cost of those services through taxes.

Cm. Russell announced that the Appraisal District has hired John Halliburton as the new director.

ORDINANCE 2005-18 – AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2005

The ordinance considers authorizing the issuance, sale, and delivery of City of Victoria Certificates of Obligation, Series 2005 in the approximate amount of \$14,250,000. Gilbert P. Reyna, Jr.

Robert Henderson, Managing Director with RBC Dain Rauscher, and Financial Advisor for the City of Victoria, reported that the amount had changed slightly. He advised that the bond rating has increase from an A+ rating to an AA- rating, which has saved money in several ways. He advised that AA- rating is an excellent rating and very few cities in Texas or any other state have received it. He advised that the net effective interest rate negotiated is 4.4694. Mr. Henderson stated that \$14,120,000 was sold but has produced \$14,500,000 in proceeds. He recommended that City Council accept the bid by the underwriters.

Mayor Armstrong asked if there were any questions from Council or the audience. There were none.

The ordinance considers authorizing the City Manager to execute the 11th amendment to the Regional Solid Waste Landfill Operations Service Contract with BFI for a consumer price index increase in selected landfill operation services rates and amending Section 24-142 of the Victoria City Code to amend fees for landfill disposal services. CITY MANAGER REPORTS

Petition to Close Three Streets in Castle Hills Subdivision

Ray Miller, Assistant Planning Director, presented a detailed report concerning a petition signed by residents of Castle Hills and Oak Ridge Subdivisions to close three public street entrances to Castle Hills Subdivision. He advised that the three entrances in question are Abbey Street at Banbury Lane, Cornwall Street at Yorkshire Lane and Durham Street at Yorkshire Lane. Following an overview, traffic counts, traffic analysis, and potential impact of the street closures, it was staffs recommendation to not close the three entrances due to concerns with response time for Fire, EMS and Police services.

Possible Closure of Sabine Street at intersection with Union Pacific

John Johnston, Director of Public Works, presented a short report on the possible closure of Sabine Street at its intersection with Union Pacific rail line near Main Street. He advised that a number of things had already been addressed in conjunction with the railroad. He reported that the crossing serves approximately 200 vehicles a day. Members of Council suggested looking at the issue and requested that it be placed on a future agenda.

RESOLUTION 2005-116R – AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF ID CARD SYSTEM AND BADGES FROM INFINITI COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGIES, INC.

The resolution authorizes the City Manager to execute all documents necessary to purchase an ID card system and badges, magnetic swipe card locks, and all installation of equipment from the lowest bidder, Infiniti Communications Technologies, Inc., of Victoria, in the amount not to exceed \$46,926, which is being funded through the 2004 Homeland Security Grant, with no requirement for City matching funds. 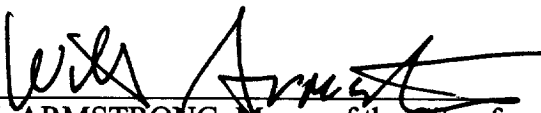

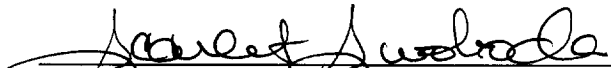

CITIZENS COMMUNICATION

Zoo Request

Tom Willis, 108 Greenwood, representing the South Texas Zoo, presented attendance comparisons for the last two years and income comparisons for the same period. He pointed out that attendance is up as well as income. He requested \$135,000 in the Fiscal Year 2005-2006. In response to a question by Cm. Guittard concerning the advantages of annexing the property that was donated to the zoo, Mr. Willis stated that the zoo needed favorable comment from the City so that they could use it in their dialog with other sources for outside funding for the new zoo.

Larry Young, 209 Pasadena, City appointee to Library Advisory Board, made two requests for consideration in the budget process. He requested salary adjustments in the amount of \$23,308 which would be used to provide a market adjustment for three Librarian I and four Librarian II positions, which would move the salaries closer in range to others offered throughout the state. The second request was an automatic door, which would allow those in wheel-chairs and others with limited mobility to enter the library more easily.
