Tell Me More!

Expand on the things your child says. For example, if your child points out a flower, respond with: “Yes, that is a flower. That kind of flower is called a rose. Roses can be red, yellow, white or pink.”

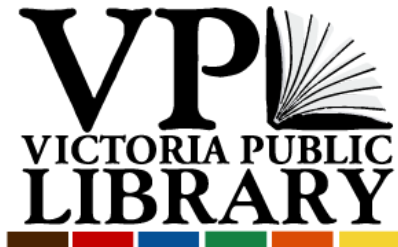
Share nursery rhymes together!

Say them fast and say them slow. Children will begin to play with and hear smaller sounds in words, which builds their phonological awareness.

Share personal stories!

Talk with your child about what it was like when you were little. Do you have any funny stories to tell? Ask them open-ended questions about what you shared.

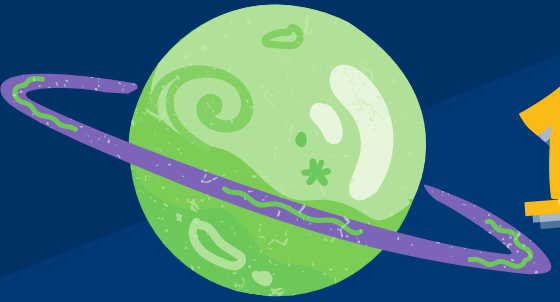

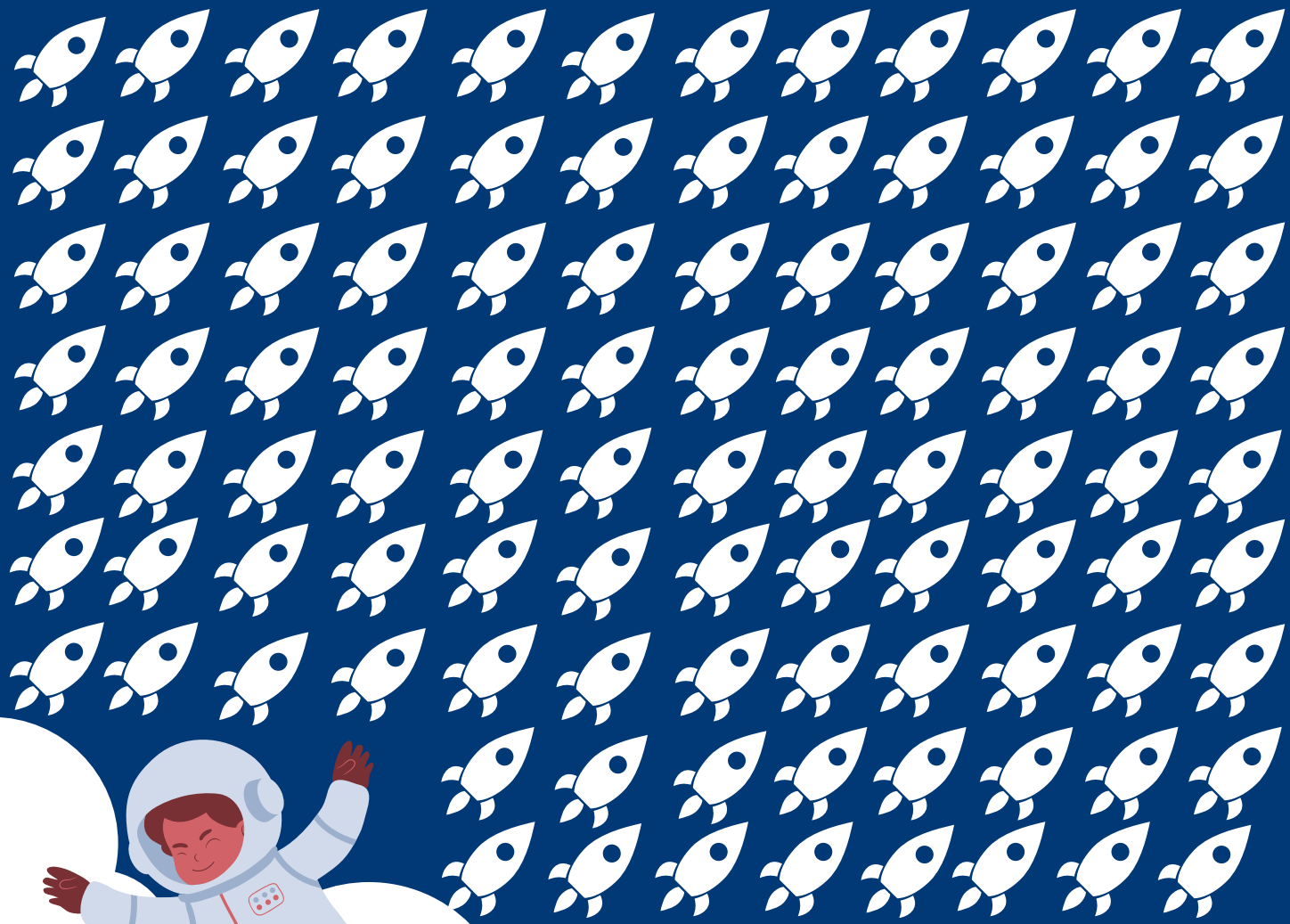
